



DP WORLD CLEANS UP MINA AL HAMRIYA

Dubai, United Arab Emirates, December 12, 2012:- In line with its environmental and corporate responsibility objectives, a team of volunteers from DP World today (12 December 2012) cleaned up the harbour foreshore in Mina Al Hamriya.

150 employees from DP World Head Office, Jebel Ali Port, Ports, Department of Planning & Development of Ports, Customs and Free Zone Corporation Trakhees, and marine services specialist P&O Maritime joined forces with DP World staff from Mina Al Hamriya to clean up the harbour foreshore in the traditional port located close to the city of Dubai on the north eastern coast.

The initiative was part of the Clean Up UAE event that receives huge support across the Emirates and is celebrated on 12th December each year. It is the 4th consecutive year that DP World has participated.

DP World traditionally focuses on coastal areas in recognition of the relationship between the port operator, coastal communities and the marine environment.

Mohammed Al Muallem, Senior Vice President and Managing Director, DP World, UAE Region, said:

“Our participation in the Clean Up UAE campaign is part of our commitment to sustainability and environment protection initiatives. In addition to serving the local fishing industry, Mina Al Hamriya plays a key role in facilitating non-containerised cargo movements between Dubai, Arabian Gulf ports and ports of East Africa and West India. Food, automobile spare parts, and livestock comprise the bulk of trade through this port.

DP World is in the process of modernising and upgrading Mina Al Hamriya, to strengthen its traditional capability and leverage the strategic location of the port in the centre of Dubai.

DP World is the lead corporate sponsor of Plastic Free Ocean, a non-profit network working to raise awareness and create viable solutions to the huge issue of plastics contaminating marine environments. In 2010, DP World became the first international marine terminal
