45 senior Emirati employees of global port operator to undergo intensive course under Leadership Development Programme

Dubai, United Arab Emirates, January 24, 2011: - DP World UAE Region today (January 24) signed an agreement with American University of Sharjah (AUS), under which AUS will provide advanced training in leadership to management executives of the premier port operator.
