DP World celebrates the 41st anniversary of its home base country and plants Union Tree at Jebel Ali Head Office

Dubai, United Arab Emirates, November 28, 2012:- DP World today celebrated the 41st UAE National Day with cultural and traditional Emirati festivities for its employees, partners, customers and friends.
