



ABU DHABI TERMINALS TO MANAGE MINA ZAYED

Close Co-operation Continues with DP World

Dubai, Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, 30 December 2010: - DP World and Abu Dhabi Terminals (ADT) announced today that, with the expiry of a five year management services agreement, from the New Year, marine terminal operations at Abu Dhabi's Mina Zayed will be handled by ADT.

The terminal is currently managed by DP World.
