Background: Tilbury Container Services

Tilbury Container Services is the only dedicated, modern direct access deep-sea terminal within the Port of London. Located on the Thames, adjacent to the M25 orbital motorway, and less than 48 kilometres from the centre of London, the terminal is one of the major gateways for animal products and a wide range of foodstuffs, both dry and refrigerated.

TCS was inaugurated in 1968 and remains as one of the largest purpose built reefer terminals in the northern hemisphere. Its shape and geographical location makes the terminal an ideal hub for all types of cargo.
